Archery Club (Grades 3-5) – Thursdays, 3:20 – 4:30 pm

COST: \$240/semester

Beginning Band Club (Grades 3-5) - Mondays, 3:30-4:30 pm

COST: \$125/semester **INSTRUCTOR:** Mrs. Kratz ***Max Enrollment of 16 students**

Have you ever wanted to learn to play a band instrument, but just don't know if it's right for you? This club will be a great way to try out a new instrument and start off with a solid foundation in instrumental performance!

- **Mondays** after school in the music room.
- Beginning instrumental instruction will be provided in a small group setting, with a band recital during the last week of club!
- For maximum benefit, students should practice at home for 10-15 minutes per weekday on non-club days.
- Parents need to provide the instrument and music stand.
- Music instruction books will be purchased by the club for students to keep.
- Includes Flute, Clarinet, and Trumpet.
- Students who have played in band for at least one semester or have permission from the instructor may choose a different band instrument, such as alto saxophone, French horn, trombone.

Class Dates: Mondays, February 3-April 27 (No Class: February 17, March 9)

Beginning Guitar Club (Grades 2-4) - Thursdays, 3:30-4:30 pm

COST: \$100/semester **INSTRUCTOR:** Ms. Cornell ***Max Enrollment of 8 students**

This club will cover guitar basics including anatomy, basic care, basic chords and basic note reading and fingering on the guitar. We will also work on songs in class once chords and some notes have been mastered. We will use the Hal Leonard Guitar for Kids Guitar Method Book along with supplemental materials. These are included in the cost of the club.

Children must have a guitar to bring to class, as this will not be provided by the school. A ¾ size guitar is recommended. Here are several options for your consideration followed by a note from Ms. Cornell:

Dear Parents,

If you wish to send me considerations I will look them over but ultimately I cannot guarantee your happiness with any particular guitar. I hope you understand. Please know that I do understand the expense of a starter guitar. I recommend a reasonable quality guitar even at this stage as a toy-style guitar usually cannot be properly tuned and may not even have the needed components referenced in a guitar class. This can become an additional frustration to a beginning student as the quality of sound is poor and the use of a poor instrument can also cause unnecessary challenges even for a skilled player. Thank you for your understanding and I hope to see your scholar in class.

Chess Emporium (Grades K-5) – Tuesdays, 3:30-4:30 pm

COST: \$199/semester

INSTRUCTOR: Chess Emporium Instructors

All grades are welcome in the chess club, which begins by teaching students how to play the game, as well as chess openings, tactics and endgames, while allowing students to practice with their friends. CrossFit Kids (Grades K-5) – Fridays, 3:30-4:30 pm

COST: \$105/7 weeks

INSTRUCTOR: CrossFit Kids

CrossFit Kids' goals are to make fitness fun, to teach foundational skills, movements, goal setting, basic nutrition, teamwork and various real world skills including math, social skills, motivation and focus. Students will learn the importance of fitness and nutrition, and have fun while doing so. A typical session will consist of a group warm-up, foundational movement development (squatting, push press, sit-ups, kettle bell swings, etc.), CrossFit workout, game, and cool down/stretch.

Drama Club (Grades 1-4) – Mondays, 3:30 – 4:30 pm

COST: \$125/semester

INSTRUCTOR: Ms. Horne

***Max Enrollment of 10 students**

Do you have a passion to act? Do you want to be a movie star or on Broadway? This club is just right for you! Drama Club gives students with similar interests in acting a place to improve their skills, as well as create everlasting bonds. Club members will be introduced to theatre, learn basic drama skills, and build up their confidence. By the end of this course, all club members will be a part of a show.

Gardening Club (K-5) – Tuesdays, 3:30 – 4:30 pm

COST: \$100/semester **INSTRUCTOR:** Mrs. Schooley ***Max Enrollment of 10 students**

In this educational and fun club, scholars will learn the basics of how to grow herbs and vegetables and get their hands dirty by planting a variety of herbs and flowers themselves.

Photography/Yearbook Club (Grades 3-5) – Mondays, 3:30 – 4:30 pm

COST: \$125/semester **INSTRUCTOR:** Mrs. Curiel ***Max Enrollment of 10 students**

This semester, students in Photography/Yearbook Club will focus on photography skills which include working with digital and stills, as well as layout and publishing.

Class Dates: Mondays, February 3-April 27 (No Class: February 17, March 9)

Piano Keyboard: Beginner Level (Grades K-5) – Mondays, 3:30 – 4:30 pm

COST: \$125/semester **INSTRUCTOR:** Dr. Hong ***Max Enrollment of 8 students**

Students will have a chance to learn the fundamentals of keyboard performance and music theory in a small group setting. Adjustments will be made based on the specific skill level of each participant, but the class as a whole will be geared towards students at an introductory level. The focus will be on developing basic piano skills, increasing finger dexterity, and appreciating classical music, all culminating in a final recital. Students should have access to a keyboard or piano at home/outside of school to allow for practice time between weekly lessons, ideally at least 10-15 minutes each day depending on their current proficiency.

Reason, Logic, Wonder and Awe (Grades 3-5) - Mondays, 3:30 – 4:30 pm

COST: \$75/semester **INSTRUCTOR:** Ms. Doll ***Max Enrollment of 22 students**

We will be investigating and discussing Great Thinkers, the Thinking/Thought Process, what Greatness means, what it means to Wonder and actually engaging in it, speaking about what Goodness, Truth and Beauty are and SO MUCH MORE!

Small Stock Club (Grade 3-5) – Students must turn 8 years old by 01/01/2020 - Select Fridays, 3:30-4:30 PM

***Registration for this year-long club occurs in the fall. Registration does not re-open for new students in the spring.**

Cost: \$100/year **INSTRUCTORS:** Ms. Williams & Mrs. Williams ***Max Enrollment of 15 students**

Students will practice leadership and responsibility by purchasing and raising their own project animal. Project options are Guinea Pig, Rabbit, or Poultry. Ms. Williams and Mrs. Williams will facilitate the animal selection process. We will not meet every week. The club will run throughout the entire school year. Participants are required to show at the Maricopa County Fair in April.

***There will be an information session on 8/30/19 to give parents the information they need for the club.** There will also be Saturday meetings (optional) that students can attend to work on their showmanship skills. The cost of the club does not include Fair entry fees. The Fair will most likely take place 4/21 – 4/26.

Steppin' Out Dance (Grades K-2) – Tuesdays, 3:30-4:30 pm

COST: \$120 **INSTRUCTORS:** Steppin' Out Dance Instructors ***Max Enrollment of 12 students**

Ballet is the technical base for all other styles of dance that are taught. Students will develop strength, poise, and flexibility as they learn routines and work on center floor skills. Jazz allows dancers to develop technical skills such as leaps and turns. This class is a well-rounded introduction to these traditional dance styles. In this interactive class, students will incorporate technical skills learned into a dynamic dance routine to be presented on the last day of class.
