11. Answers will vary but will draw details from the story to compare Jim Smiley to the man he bet on Daniel Webster with. For example: *Jim and the other man both like to gamble and rely on the other person's gullibility and naivety to win their way. They both use distraction and their wits and are clever deceivers. However, Jim is a part of his town and seems to still get along with his peers, while the other man is a stranger. Also, Jim never personally harms his opponents' animals, while the stranger is willing to fill Jim's frog with buckshot.*
12. Answers will vary. Example: *Wheeler certainly admires and seems to value Smiley and his devious ways. While Smiley likes to bet, he doesn't cheat people. The animals that he cultivates are probably of no use to anyone else until Smiley finds a use for them. The animals seem to have an uncanny way of coming through in the end. They are the underdogs. Smiley's luck mostly comes from the fact that he knows that people will underestimate these animals.* Answers will conclude with the student's own opinion of Smiley. Students may agree with Wheeler's interpretation of Smiley as clever and admirable, or may disagree and view Smiley as dishonest.
