## Archway Trivium West (K-5) Daily Student Temperature Checks to Enter Campus

Student Temperature Checks for K-5th grade students will begin at 7:20 am each school day. If students arrive on campus with a parent (i.e. they didn't cycle, walk or ride with a student driver) they MUST stay with their parent until they have their temperature checked. Face coverings (from home) are required to be worn during temperature screenings and while approaching/entering the building. A temperature reading of less than 100.0 is required to enter campus. After entering campus, 1st-5th grade students will proceed directly to their classroom; Kindergarten students will proceed to the playground.

Upon arrival at school, students should proceed to one of the following locations for a required temperature check:



# Archway Trivium West (K-5<sup>th</sup>) Student Temperature Check Stations

- Car Line Drop-off Lanes: Students stay in car (Curbside or Fieldside Drop-off)
- Parent Walk-up at southside MPR Doors

• Bikers/Walkers/Riding with a Student Driver at benches along north side of ATW building

IF YOUR STUDENT ARRIVES LATE TO SCHOOL - You must park and escort your student to the front office for a temperature check/late sign-in.

Every student/staff member/visitor will have his/her temperature taken upon arrival to school each day with a no-touch thermometer. Please see below for detailed procedures specific to each Student Temperature Check Station.

## Car Line Temperature Checks (Curbside OR Field-side)

Teachers will take K-5 students temperatures at the car line (8 cars at a time). A student with a temperature of less than 100.0 will exit the car and enter campus:

- **Curbside Drop-off:** Students will enter campus via the ATW Atrium doors.
- Field-side Drop-off: Students will exit the car and wait at the crosswalk (look for socially-distanced markers on the sidewalk--one per family). When the crossing guard signals, students will cross and enter campus via the north-facing MPR doors.

If a student's temperature is 100.0 or greater, the student will STAY in the car and may either go home or proceed to the Secondary Temperature Check Station (see below for details). Trivium Prep (6th-12th) siblings who are dropped off in the ATW car line will exit the car and proceed to a separate TVP Temperature Check Station.

# Walk-up Stations

• Parent Walk-up at southside MPR Door

Parents park in the designated parent parking spaces in the single row nearest the field, facing the field. Please do not park in other spots, as they have been purchased by Prep students. Parents will accompany their children to the southside MPR doors, waiting on the safe-distancing markers at both the crosswalk and again near the MPR doors. Parents must wait with their child until a temperature reading has been conducted. If a student's temperature is less than 100.0, they will enter the MPR.

If a student's temperature is 100.0 or greater, the student/parent may either go home or proceed to the Secondary Temperature Check Station (see below for details).

• Unaccompanied Cyclists/Walkers/Students arriving with Trivium Prep student drivers (Trivium Prep siblings will proceed to a separate TVP Temperature Check location).

This line is ONLY for students whose parents do not drive them to campus. Parents who choose to park on campus must use the Parent Walk-up station at the southside MPR Door. Students enter campus and proceed to the benches along the north side of the Archway building (cyclists should park their bikes, then proceed to this station). A teacher will either take their temperature immediately or give the students some time to "cool down" before having their temperature checked. A student with a temperature of less than 100.0 will enter campus via the ATW Atrium doors.

If a student's temperature is 100.0 or greater, the student will proceed to the Secondary Temperature Check Station (see below for details).

## <u>Secondary Temperature Checks (If a student has a temperature of 100.0 or greater):</u>

A student with a temperature reading of 100.0 or above will not enter the building unless a second temperature reading is less than 100.0. In this case, the student will proceed to a Secondary Thermometer Check-in Station, a designated outdoor screening area. Here, after a "cool down" period, the school nurse or other designee will reassess the student's temperature with a temporal thermometer. If a second temperature check determines the student has a temperature of 100.0 or greater, the student will be sent home. It is the parent's responsibility to call in the student as "sick" to the Archway Trivium West Attendance Line: (623) 565-5490.

- **Car Line Secondary Station** Located in the parking lot. Parents will be directed to park and wait for a second temperature reading for their child. Optionally, they may skip this step and take the child directly home.
- Walk-up Secondary Stations Located near the walk-up stations. Parents should wait with their child during the second temperature reading. Optionally, they may skip this step and take the child directly home. For students arriving to campus unaccompanied by an adult (Bikers/Walkers/Riding with a Trivium Prep student), the parent will be asked to pick up the child from school, should they have a second temperature reading of 100.0 or greater.

#### **General Reminders/Suggestions:**

- 1. Students and parents should wear face coverings during temperature checks and when approaching/entering the building.
- 2. Taking your child's temperature at home each morning before school will minimize the possibility of your student being sent home and best protects other students/staff.
- 3. Curbside drop-off from an air-conditioned car minimizes the chance of a "false positive" reading.
- 4. Students who walk/bike to school may need to allow for extra time to sit and "cool down" before proceeding to the Student Temperature Check Station.

- 5. Arriving early in the drop-off window will help lines move faster to ensure your child arrives to class on-time.
- 6. If your child is sent home, it is the parent's responsibility to call the Attendance Line and leave a message explaining the absence.

## "SCREENING FOR ILLNESS STARTS AT HOME"

In partnership with parents, potential Covid-19 positive cases can be minimized in the schools by closely observing your child for signs and symptoms of Covid-19. If your child is not feeling well, take their temperature prior to coming to school. If their temperature is greater than 100.0, keep your child home. In addition, students that manifest the following symptoms: cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, chills, repeated shaking with chills, muscle pain or body aches, headache, sore throat, new loss of taste or smell, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea, fatigue, congestion or runny nose should remain home and a medical professional may need to be contacted.
