# **Club Descriptions**

Ancient Greek Club (3-5) -Thursdays, 3:30-4:30 pm

COST: \$100/semester INSTRUCTOR: Mr. O'Sullivan \*Max Enrollment 10 students

Class Dates: Thursdays, January 26-May 4, 2023 (No class: March 16)

This club provides an introduction to the Ancient Greek language, with a view to preparing the scholars with a basic understanding of the language. The focus will be on Homeric Greek. We will be reading passages from Homer's Iliad in the original Greek.

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Chess Emporium (Grades K-5) – Tuesdays, 3:30-4:30 pm

**COST: \$170**/semester **INSTRUCTOR:** Chess Emporium Instructors

Chess Emporium teaches a fun and exciting introduction to the game of chess. All grades are welcome in the chess club, which begins by teaching students how to play the game, as well as chess openings, tactics and endgames, while allowing students to practice with their friends. Studies by major corporations and universities have shown that chess can help students increase their math and verbal skills, as well as their creative and critical thinking abilities. We will enjoy painting, sand art, paper art and many other creative projects. Crafting brings me joy and I hope to share my love of crafting with your child. There will be eleven classes all together and your child will bring home at least one craft per class. You will not need to purchase anything, but I do recommend an apron. Creating can be messy!

### Gardening (Grades 3-5) - Tuesdays, 3:30 - 4:30 pm

COST: \$125/semester INSTRUCTOR: Ms. Catania \*Max Enrollment of 11 students

Class Dates: Tuesdays, January 24-May 2, 2023 (No class: March 14)

Gardening Club members will learn to plan, prepare, plant, and take care of a garden. As we plan our school garden, members will read seed packets to determine the best place to plant. Next, members will prepare the garden beds and plant the seeds for the school garden. They will also plant seeds to care for at home. Club members will learn to take care of the garden, including how much to water and how to check for garden pests or diseases on the plants. Along with this, members will learn about pollinators, harvesting, and saving seeds.

Mad Science Club (Grades K-5) – Fridays, 3:30-4:30 pm

COST: \$160 INSTRUCTORS: Mad Science Instructors \*Max Enrollment of 20 students

Class Dates: 8 weeks: Fridays, February 17-May 12 (No Class on March 10, March 17, March 24, April 7, April 28)

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Ready, Set, Science! Your students will love our interactive after-school programs that foster creative thinking and problem solving. Our STEM programs cover a wide range of science topics and provide children with the opportunity to experience science in a hands-on way. This semester we will cover the following topics:

<u>Piano Keyboard: Advanced Beginner (Grades 1-5)</u> – Two Sections Offered: Mondays, 3:30 – 4:30 pm <u>OR</u> 4:30-5:30 PM\*

COST: \$125/semester INSTRUCTOR: Dr. Hong \*<u>Max Enrollment of 8 students</u>

\*Parents enrolling in the 4:30pm Piano Club must pick up their students during regular dismissal (3pm). Students should then return to school in uniform, entering campus from the MPR between 4:15-4:30pm.

Class Dates: Mondays, January 23-May April 24, 2023 (No Class: Feb 20, March 13, April 10)

Students will have a chance to learn the fundamentals of keyboard performance and music theory in a small group setting. Adjustments will be made based on the specific skill level of participants. While the class is meant to be geared towards beginning students, it should not be their very first experience with the instrument. Therefore, some familiarity with the keyboard and basic recognition of music is helpful. A group instruction class obviously doesn't allow for as much individual attention if a student is a beginner. The focus is on improving existing keyboard skills, developing finger dexterity, and appreciating classical music, while culminating in a recital. Students should have access to a keyboard or piano at home/outside of school to allow for practice time between weekly lessons, ideally at least 10-15 minutes each day depending on their current proficiency.

Steppin' Out Dance (Grades K-2) – Mondays, 3:30-4:30 pm

COST: \$125 INSTRUCTORS: Steppin' Out Dance Instructors \*Max Enrollment of 15 students
Class Dates: 11 weeks: Mondays, January 23-April 24, 2023 No class: Feb 20, March 13, April 10)

Ballet is the technical base for all other styles of dance that are taught. Students will develop strength, poise, and flexibility as they learn routines and work on center floor skills. Jazz allows dancers to develop technical skills such as leaps and turns. This class is a well-rounded introduction to these traditional dance styles. In this interactive class, students will incorporate technical skills learned into a dynamic dance routine to be presented on the last day of class. Class Dates: 14 weeks: Thursdays, January 26-May 4, 2023 No class: March 16)

This class is designed for elementary school aged kids! In this class, your student will be taken through a series of yoga poses, yoga-themed games, and breathing and coping techniques, as well as being given discussion concerning virtues and story times that reinforce those virtues for a well-rounded development experience. Students will be provided with a yoga mat on the first day of class that will be kept at school and sent home with the student on the last day of the club. This class is taught by a Trivium Prep alumni.
