**Kaleidoscope Color**, by Andy Beck, is a song where music meets art in the colors of the kaleidoscope! This original work pairs two colorful melodies and includes an echo refrain. A kaleidoscope is an optical instrument in a tube with two or more reflecting surfaces inside, so that objects on one end of these mirrors are shown as symmetrical patterns when viewed from the other end. A kaleidoscope often contains a cell on one end with broken pieces of glass or colored materials. The kaleidoscope was named after the Greek word “Kalos,” which means “beauty.” Ideal for beginning harmony singers, these parts are easy to hear, learn, and hold successfully.

"**Dona Nobis Pacem**," is Latin for “Grant Us Peace.” It is a prayer song which has a simple, but powerful message that is still very relevant today. "**Dona Nobis Pacem**" was written in the 16<sup>th</sup> or 17<sup>th</sup> century by an unknown composer in Germany as a Christmas song. It is often sung around Christmas-time due to its message of peace on Earth. “**Dona Nobis Pacem**” is partnered with “**Peace Like a River**,” an African American Spiritual based on Isaiah 66:12, where the Lord says He will extend “peace like a river” to Jerusalem.

"I need to whisper something to you.
